## Tech Savvy Comes to Santa Barbara!

In last month's Coast Connections we told you that Jill Dunlap, branch member and UCSB Liaison, had applied for a Tech Savvy grant of \$8,000 from AAUW National to bring to UCSB a one-day STEM conference for 6th to 9th grade girls and their families. Well, by golly, she won one!

Congratulations to Jill and the WISE group (Women in Science and Engineering) at UCSB. Only ten grants were given as pilot projects for Tech Savvy, a program begun by the Buffalo, NY branch. The USCB proposal is the only one in California that was accepted for funding.
