AAUW Executive Director Speaks Out on Continuing Wage Gap

WASHINGTON — AAUW Executive Director and CEO Linda D. Hallman, CAE, today issued the following statement in response to the findings from the just-released U.S. Census Bureau report, <u>Income, Poverty, and Health Insurance Coverage in the</u> <u>United States: 2012</u>.

We are disappointed by the Census Bureau's latest economic snapshot showing that the gender wage gap remains stagnant. Unfortunately for women and their families, it's the same old story — another year of no improvement. Women working full time in the United States are still paid only 77 percent of what men are paid, just as they were a decade ago. For African American and Hispanic woman, the gap is even wider. It's clear that this problem is not going to fix itself — we need strategies to address it. Although we always hope for appropriate legislation from Congress, given the stalemate on Capitol Hill, we're urging President Obama to do all he can through the executive branch to move the ball down the field. This stagnation must end, for the good of women and the nation. As an organization working tirelessly on behalf of economic justice, AAUW is committed to seeing the wage gap eliminated for all women.

From Our AAUW CA President, Alicia Hetman

I hope you had a great AAUW September and are ready to bring more AAUW visibility to your community in October. There are so many different ways that we can each, individually and as branch members, market AAUW. We are in the business of "breaking down barriers for all women and girls" so what are you doing to break down barriers for your own members and potential new members in your community?

Your AAUW CA leaders have been very busy this summer on a variety of AAUW projects. I have spent the last three months visiting branches and IBCs and working on some new partnership opportunities for AAUW CA.

I am very happy to report that AAUW CA has successfully completed a first event with a brand new partner --- the WNBA's LA Sparks. I28 AAUW members, family and friends, including a high school and a community college basketball teams, invited by members of the Victor Valley Branch, went to the last home game of the LA Sparks so that we could Stand Up for Title IX. California is the first state in AAUW to be building an ongoing partnership with a professional women's sport team, something that was a recommendation of our 21st Century Task Force report. This has been a remarkable opportunity to "market" AAUW in new ways and to a different audience. The team gave us a membership table in the main concourse before, during and after the game. Our the state membership chair, Ginny Hatfield, and members provided an array of AAUW materials, answered inquires and kept a list of potential members to contact as part of the Shape the Future campaign.

AAUW produced a new 30 second Public Service Announcement (PSA) that was unveiled at the beginning of half time on the Jumbotron so AAUW was on the screen for everyone to see. The PSA is now available on the website for others to use, but we were first! We were wearing AAUW We Love Title IX T-shirts created by AAUW staff and sold by the LACIC (order forms available on our website). National also sent Title IX handouts for us to distribute and our Chief Strategic Officer, Mark Hopkins came to California to attend the game with us.

This was truly an exciting new way to raise awareness of AAUW and the work we did to get Title IX passed and to build our membership. The Sparks also allowed us to use their "for members only" Lexus Room to host a reception prior to the game. We were extremely honored that the CEO of the LA Sparks, Paula Williams Madison, came to the reception to speak to us. She told her story -- an immigrant child, raised in Harlem, graduated from Vassar College, and built a business empire with her siblings. Her story is very compelling and she really spoke to the young women from the two basketball teams to let them know that if they work hard, they too can be high achievers! We hope that she'll be a speaker at our 2014 AAUW CA Convention at the LAX Marriott, April 11-13 and I hope you'll be there to hear her story.

Now, if that wasn't enough to inspire you to try something new....I thanked Ms Williams Madison after she spoke and gifted her with her first year's AAUW membership! I also gifted a membership to Liz Rizza, the Account Specialist responsible for reaching out to me about partnering with the team and she worked tirelessly for this partnership. They will soon be members of National, California and the CA Online Branch. There's more...

During halftime I had the opportunity to speak with the Sparks President, Vincent Malcolm, and tell him about AAUW's Shape the Future membership campaign in which those who join AAUW during a public event get half off on their National dues. I asked if he'd be interested in having the team pay for memberships for the players. Sometimes, all you need to do is ask! He said yes and now his staff is collecting the necessary information for these memberships to happen! I even suggested, in my follow-up email, that he may want to add himself and others to the list. Who knows just how many new members we will find through this partnership!

This is something that each AAUW leader can do in one place or another. Think about what is available in your community, think about starting a new partnership with an organization or a group of people that will want to Stand Up for Title IX with you. Sometimes, our biggest barriers are our own fears of trying something new and different.

I expect great things from you as I know that everyone who has a deep and abiding belief in the AAUW Mission can make a significant contribution to the work of AAUW. Building our membership with people who believe in our AAUW work to bring equality into the world is such a rewarding job.



Have a tremendous AAUW October----go out and try something new and different to bring visibility to AAUW's great work in your community too.
