One of the primary ways in which AAUW furthers its mission is through advocating for issues with Congress. But advocacy isn't just about AAUW lending our name to an issue or speaking up on Capitol Hill. Advocacy is about AAUW members and all citizens concerned with equity being knowledgeable and aware of the current status of important issues.

You can be a direct part of these advocacy efforts by becoming an AAUW Two--Minute Activist. By signing up with this AAUW program, you will receive urgent e-mail notices to contact your members of Congress, our governor, or California legislators on AAUW issues. Each email will have a button to link you directly to a prepared email message (which you can personalize if you wish) and a way to send it off to your legislators with a click of your mouse.

## **AAUW CA Action Priorities 2013-15**

The 2013-15 Action Priorities for AAUW California were approved by the membership in our Spring 2013 elections. AAUW California's public policy priorities are consistent with national AAUW Public Policy Principles which can be found on <a href="https://www.aauw.org/resource/principles-and-priorities/">www.aauw.org/resource/principles-and-priorities/</a>.

The AAUW CA Public Policy program supports its mission to advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy and research, and complements the national Public Policy program.

AAUW CA's priorities for action are chosen according to the criteria of viability, critical need, and strong member support. All members were invited to respond to a questionnaire regarding the priorities which AAUW CA should place on California legislation affecting women and girls during the next two years. The results of the fall, 2012 survey are reflected below, in order of priority in each category. Highest prioritywithin each category is marked with an \* as determined by member responses.

#### To achieve economic self-sufficiency for all women AAUW supports:

- Pay equity and fairness in compensation. \*
- Equitable access and advancement in employment, including vigorous enforcement ofemployment antidiscrimination statutes.
- Strengthening retirement benefits and programs, including pension improvements and protecting Social Security from privatization.
- Programs that provide women with education, training, and support for success in the work force.
- Strengthening programs, including welfare and career and technical education, to improve postsecondary education access, career development, and earning potential.
- Greater availability of and access to a high standard of benefits and policies that promote work-life balance.

#### To support a strong system of public education, AAUW advocates:

- Adequate and equitable funding for quality public education for all students. \*
- Increased support for programs that break through barriers for women and girls in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) fields.
- Protection of programs that meet the needs of girls and women in all levels of education, including vigorous enforcement of Title IX and all other civil rights laws pertaining to education.
- Opposition to the use of public funds for nonpublic elementary and secondary education and for charter schools that do not adhere to the same civil rights and accountability standards as required of public schools.
- Support for and access to higher education for women and disadvantaged populations.

# To guarantee equality, individual rights and social justice for a diverse society, AAUW supports:

- Choice in the determination of one's reproductive life. \*
- Freedom from violence and fear of violence, including bullying and sexual harassment, in homes, schools, workplaces, and communities.
- Increased access to quality, affordable health care, and family planning services, including expansion of patient rights.
- Support for United Nations programs that address human rights and women's and girls' concerns.
- Freedom in definition of family, and guarantee of civil rights in all family structures.
- Vigorous protection of and full access to civil and constitutional rights
