AAUW Observes Equal Pay Day



On Tuesday, April 12, AAUW and our powerful nationwide network observed Equal Pay Day, the symbolic day when women's earnings finally catch up to men's earnings from the previous year. While women working full time, on average, are paid 79 percent of what white, non-Hispanic men are paid, it's important to remember that the pay gap impacts different women in different ways. Women of color and moms have to wait even longer into the new year for their salaries to catch up. AAUW hosted its annual block party, and it was an unqualified success – we might even call it a blowout! Friends, neighbors, and fellow equal pay champions were invited to

AAUW headquarters to enjoy an "unhappy hour," snacks from a woman-owned food truck, live music, and notable guest speakers. Attendees also heard an exciting announcement on a new collaboration between AAUW and Washington, D.C. Mayor Muriel Bowser's Office on Women's Policy and Initiatives to close the gender pay gap in the district!

Before the block party, AAUW hosted a private reception with Representatives Rosa DeLauro (D-CT) and Carolyn Maloney (D-NY), along with Academy Award-winning actress and equal pay activist Patricia Arquette, for AAUW staff, coalition allies, and Capitol Hill advocates who work tirelessly on equal pay. All three women praised AAUW's leadership, spoke passionately about the need for pay equity, and urged passage of the Paycheck Fairness Act.

Representatives DeLauro and Maloney praised Arquette for elevating the issue of pay equity to a wider audience than ever before. In 2014, Patricia Arquette won the Oscar for best supporting actress for her role in Boyhood, and in her acceptance speech she unabashedly called for fair wages and equal rights for women in America. Since then, Arquette has publicly been championing for equal pay and the Equal Rights Amendment.

Thanks to AAUW members nationwide, there is a newly elevated level of discourse surrounding equal pay, and it's clear that the American people want real action to erase the gender pay gap. This is now an issue that is being discussed by politicians and constituents on both sides of the aisle, and thanks to AAUW leadership and advocacy at the state level, we're starting to see the results as more states move to enact equal pay laws.

Equal Pay Day is not only a great public awareness effort, it's also a great reminder that there is still a lot more work to be done; throughout the year, we will be marking Equal Pay Days for African American women, moms, and Latinas. Congress must pass the Paycheck Fairness Act to ensure that women receive equal pay for equal work. As I stood amongst our AAUW family – advocates, champions, and friends – I was reminded of the power of citizens working together for pay equity. I am proud of the progress we've made, and know that we will keep fighting until we no longer have to commemorate Equal Pay Day. Instead, we'll celebrate our Paycheck Fairness Day.

The girls were very grateful that Linda Stinebaugh, the AAUW State Coordinator for Tech Trek, was able to teach the classes and bring all the computer equipment. We had 7 participants in each 3-hour session and the girls learned to program their own computer apps using the App Inventor software. All 14 girls enjoyed a pizza lunch together. You can see from their smiling faces that it was a fun day!
