Census Data on the Pay Gap

On September 16, 2015, we received updated census data on the pay gap — women made only 79 cents on the dollar earned by men in 2014. While this is an increase (but not a statistically significant one) from 2013 when women made 78 cents on the man's dollar, it's frustrating to get just a drop in the bucket when what women really need is an equal pay tidal wave.

If we're going to make real economic progress for women and families, Congress must take legislative action. AAUW continues to lead the charge to pass the Paycheck Fairness Act, a much needed update to the Equal Pay Act of 1963. But until Congress acts on behalf of all Americans, AAUW will continue to fight at the state level to bring about change one state at a time.

On September 17thAAUW released a number of tools to help tackle pay inequality and empower you to make change in your state. We updated our seminal report, <u>The Simple Truth about the Gender Pay Gap</u>. We released a brand new analysis of existing state laws. And we created state-by-state roadmaps for addressing the pay gap at both the Congressional and state level with recommendations tailored to each state's legal land-scape.

I am so proud of the work that we did to compile and present this information, and I am excited to collaborate with you all to make real progress. On Wednesday night we hosted a call for State and Branch Public Policy Chairs to discuss these findings and resources. The questions that members asked and the engagement on these issues that you all demonstrated is the reason that I was excited to join the AAUW staff when I came on board 6 months ago. There are many organizations out there doing important work, but the loyal and active membership of AAUW is unique. Together, we can take these data and recommendations and use it to pressure our elected officials. Because women need real change, not pocket change.

In addition to facing a pay gap, women also face a significant retirement savings gap. Women must save \$126 for every \$100 a man saves in retirement funds. A man who wants to retire at age 65 must save an additional \$270,000 for average retirement expenses, but a woman must save \$522,000.
