She founded and directed the Yoga Experience in Cambridge where she initiated hundreds of students to yoga and meditation. Senior student of Zen master Thich Nhat Hanh, she was instrumental in having him published in France after she translated one of his books. In 2003, her spiritual memoir La Reparation was published in Paris to critical acclaim. She has studied and practiced yoga and meditation for over 25 years with teachers such as Patricia Walden, Joseph Goldstein, and Pema Chodron.

Elizabeth Rumelt (Elly) was born on September 17th in New York City. She attended college in Philadelphia, NY and Boston for graduate school. She was a history major. She has also lived in Teheran, Fontainbleu (France), Los Angeles and Santa Barbara as a "trailing spouse".

As a child, Elly always wanted to work for social justice. She was very influenced by a book by Jacob Riis-"How the Other Half Lives" and by a girls' book called "Mary

Ware". Both books were about the effects of slums and the fight for safe housing. In college, she was active in the civil rights movement and says she "served the necessary days in jail in Cambridge, Maryland".

Elly is married and has one daughter who is the author of many best-selling books for young adults (also enjoyed by adults) who goes under the pen name of Cassandra Clare.

After receiving her degree, she went straight to graduate school to study social work and has worked in that field ever since. She says that since her degree is very versatile she has worked as a therapist, a teacher of behavioral science to physicians and of gender studies to an international group of women, a clinical supervisor and a director of programs.

She enjoys traveling and her favorite trip was to the Virunga Volcanoes in Uganda, the haunt of the mountain gorillas, well- known from "Gorillas in the Mist".

Her favorite book is "A Dance to the Music of Time" which is a 12 volume novel sequence sometimes compared to Proust in its portrait of the change in society over time. She says, it repays re-reading it and watching it over and over on the mini -series made by British TV Channel Four. Bach is her favorite composer and her favorite and only hobby is reading. Her favorite color is blue.

She joined AAUW for a sense of women's history and hopes to be able to move that history forward.

Title IX Sexual Violence Complaints and Investigations Increasing

In response to an inquiry from Senators Barbara Boxer (D-CA) and Kristen Gillibrand (D-NY), Department of Education officials provided data regarding Title IX sexual violence complaints. Not only are the number of sexual violence complaints reported to the department increasing, so too is the average length of investigations. From fiscal years 2013-2014, the reported complaints rose from 64 to 123, which could be attributed to greater public awareness and federal enforcement. Also, it has become the policy of the department to do a complete Title IX review when a complaint is filed, which has increased the duration of investigations but improved their thoroughness and the school's overall compliance with Title IX.


